The next months the Methodological guide will be available in English through INSPIRE project's website. The partners are currently developing the structure of the Methodological guide and the combination of the result of their research.

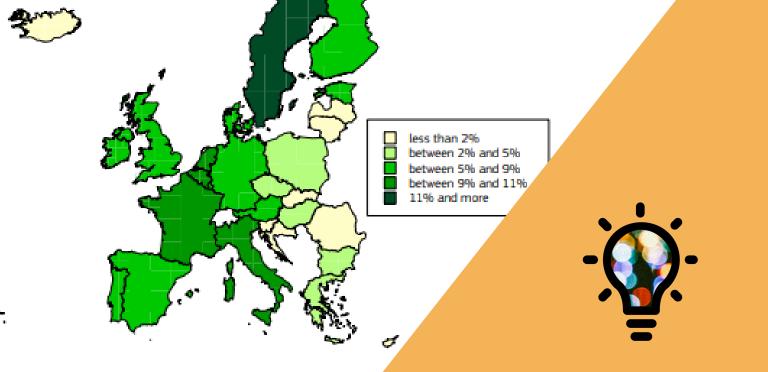
Some key results illustrated in the guide will be:

- key specifications of the other outputs of the project and their evaluation

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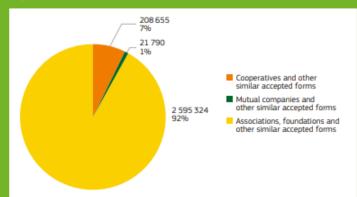


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Social economy in Europe today employs more than 14.5 million people/ 6.5% of the active population of the EU-27 and 7.4% of the EU-15.
